Re: Early morning noise disruptions

Dear Mr. Thomas and Town Council members:

I was sleeping under the stars last night (June 29, 2025) when at around 12:00 a.m. a small, noisy car with extremely bright lights backed down Myrtle Street from around the entrance to the medical center down to at or about 511 Myrtle Street. They stayed parked in the middle of the road with their engine running and lights at their brightest for at or about 15 minutes. I looked at the clock at one point and it read 12:07 a.m.

After a point-in-time I walked down to get their license plate which is CJH6908. Their car is small with some kind of a rack on top. (JoyTutus or something like that). The headlights make it look like a "bug" and the engine makes it sound like a "bug."

As I got their license plate, the driver put the car in "drive" and they proceeded down Myrtle Street toward Maple Avenue - which they turned on.

For at least an hour they drove around the Town of La Conner - LOUDLY. I know because I could hear them in the quiet of the night.

I am sending this for two reasons:

1. The presence of disrespectful, loud, drivers traveling at excessively high speeds has increased steadily in the Town of La Conner. A trend which seems to be unchecked by the Town and its "peace officer/law enforcement" contract personnel. Another example of this is the black sedan missing a front left bumper portion that was speeding around town, including Morris and First Streets, over this past weekend.

2. To provide a record so that if the driver of this or other vehicle causes any "damage" or "harm" to one or more residents of the Town of La Conner that there is a record on hand that the Town of La Conner and the Sheriff's department had explicit foreknowledge that a problem of this sort existed.

I realize writing and sending this letter is likely an exercise in futility. The ineptitude of the Skagit County Sheriff's Office where the Town of La Conner is concerned has not improved over the years. However, maybe this letter will provide the incentive they need or the residents of La Conner will get lucky and the Sheriff's office will actually do the job they are paid for.
